This Sunday's Readings:

Exodus 20: 14, 7-9, 12-20. The Ten Commandments are the foundation of faith and ethics, not only for the Jews, but also for Christians. Their origin lies deep within the civilizations of the ancient Middle East.

Philippians 3: 4b – 14. Paul recalls his once anti-Christian stance, and the transformation that faith in Christ has brought.

Matthew 21: 33 – 46. This very pointed parable is aimed at religious leaders who have persecuted the prophetic voice of Judaism through the ages.
